A. Difference Between God's Good and Evil and the Worlds (Malachi 2:17 – 3:5)

- Culture Things that are evil to God are being called good in the secular world. Speaking out on what God considers evil, may be a bad thing based on cultures current beliefs.
- 2. Culture God is not doing anything in our world to make a difference, therefore people will do what is right in their own eyes.

Culture takes a truth about God and twist it to a false narrative.

Example: No matter what you do, God loves you. Therefore the false belief is... because God loves all people, he does not judge them.

B. Judgment is Coming

Who will be judged?

- 1. People living in Sin (Sexual lifestyles, ethics and those that oppose God.)
- 2. Employees who tak advantage of Employees
- 3. Those who take advantage of widows and orphans
- 4. Those who take advantage of Immigrants

Why do People do these things?

- They do not fear God!
- They do not understand Gods truth God Loves you, therefore he wants you to follow Him and live according to his commands.

Application of God's Social Justice

- 1. Do not avoid Social Justice because it does not fit your politics.
- 2. Our world needs to hear Biblically based views on Social Justice.
- 3. Employees need to be fair and have a true concern for their employers.
- 4. Leave judgment to God!

C. Overview of Malachi 3:6 -18

Repent

- 1. We are not always aware of our sin, but when we become aware, we need to repent.
- 2. Repent when we do not obey God.

Results of Repentance in how we live.

- We will give back to God through our tithes.
- We will serve God and follow his commands

The Benefits of Repentance and living for God.

- We will be in a relationship with God and experience Heaven.
- We will be protected from punishment.
