Paul's Concerns

- Marriage Would a woman's marriage be at risk due to her role in ministry.
- Motherhood Would a woman's family and her ability to raise her children be harmed due to her role in ministry.
- Unity Would the role of the woman become divisive to the local church.
- Sharing the Gospel Would the role of the woman have a negative impact on the church being able to share the gospel in that particular culture.

Ordination

Scripture teaches very little about Ordination: Here is what we know...

- 1. A person responds to God's call in their lives.
- 2. The church recognizes their gifts and God's call in their life.
- 3. The church prays for their ministry as they designate them for ministry.

Therefore, Ordination is the church's public recognition of God's choice for leadership.

Final Thoughts

- The role of Women in Ministry should not be an issue that divides the church.
- The church should be careful to condemn a woman who responds to God's call in their life or condemning a church that recognizes God's call in a woman's life.
- Scripture has taught us that God will choose those who he calls to ministry and who were given specific gifts regardless of whether it is a Male or Female.
